**spinal cord** /ˌspɑːnəl ˈkɔːd/  
rdzeń kręgowy

The **spinal cord** is a long, cylindrical structure that extends from the base of the brain, known as the brainstem, down the vertebral column.

**incomplete injury** /ˌɪnkəmˈpli:t ˈɪndʒəri/  
częściowe uszkodzenie

An **incomplete** spinal cord **injury** refers to a condition where there is some degree of preserved sensory or motor function below the level of the injury.

**nociceptive pain**  
/ˌnəʊsɪˈseptɪv peɪn/  
ból nocyceptywny

Unlike neuropathic pain, which results from damage to the nervous system itself, **nociceptive pain** is a response to ongoing tissue damage or inflammation.

**pressure ulcer**  
/ˈpreʃər ˈʌl.sər/  
odleżyna

Pressure sores, also known as **pressure ulcers** or bedsores are skin injuries caused by prolonged pressure on the skin.

**tetraplegia** /ˌtetrəˈpliːdʒə/  
tetraplegia

**Tetraplegia**, also known as quadriplegia, is a condition in which we observe paralysis or significant impairment in motor and sensory function in all four limbs, as well as the torso.
